MEMBERSHIP:

Membership Update as of 1/11/16 992 families joined in MSA (out of total of 1092 families). This brings membership levels to 91%. Two additional families joined and not yet in MSA. PROCESS FOR MEMBERSHIP AFTER EARLY SEPTEMBER

Put in place a process for handling new APT memberships once directories/memberships are finalized for directory distribution. A report is downloaded from InfoSnap bi-weekly (also check for new members via paypal and REVRAK) and new families that have joined the APT these families are then 1). emailed information on how to set up an MSA account (a reminder is sent if necessary). The mid year new members letter is available/saved on the shared Directory/Membership google drive. 2). A directory is delivered to their home. 3). Once they have set up an MSA account they are added as a member and given online access and sent a welcome e mail.

REFUNDS

All refunds have been processed.

There was a free food sampling during lunch at DPM in December of an existing item on the DPM menu: turkey taco meat and tortilla chips. This was well received by the students, who ate all the samples that were prepared with rationing needed for the last lunch period. However, Quest did not notice an increase in sales of the turkey tacos the next time it was offered on the lunch line. Given the cost of sampling food for all the students, Quest is going to limit food sampling to new items for DPM.

March is National Nutrition Month. The theme is "Savor the Flavor of Healthy Eating". There will be a special menu item available for purchase on March 2nd – a baked cuban sandwich with ham, turkey, swiss cheese, pickles and mustard. On March 8th, there will be a free sample of a morrocan carrot salad – carrots, raisins, mint, and spices.
