President - Call to Order

Tom Cardamone, Principal 5/6 and Michael Kroll, Assistant Principal 5/6

- EFFORT is sponsoring Spirit Week next week. It coincides with Red Ribbon Week and Halloween. Letters will be mailed home and information about Spirit Week will be in the Friday Flyers. Here is a breakdown of the week:
 - Monday pajama day
 - Tuesday wear red day
 - Wednesday sports team day
 - Thursday accessorize your teacher day
 - Friday Halloween costume and Fall Festival day (5th/6th will have their festival in the afternoon, 7th/8th will have theirs in the morning)
- The Choral Concert is at 7pm tomorrow night in the auditorium.
- The Orchestra will perform on Thursday at 7pm in the LFHS auditorium.
- The Band Concert is Wednesday, 11/5, in the Peck gym.
- See the school website and Friday Flyers for more information about the Fine Arts events.
- The Scheduling Committee has been hard at work:
 - There are currently 3 different bell schedules at DPM (5th, 6th, and 7th/8th). There are also different length class periods in different grade levels.
 - The goal is to come up with a schedule that gives all students opportunities to participate in classes and activities. For example, the BOC kids can only participate in one of the five Related Arts classes offered on the 7th/8th side, while non-BOC kids participate in all five.
 - There are 12 staff members on the committee; every grade level, core subject and the encore/related arts groups are represented.
 - \circ $\;$ The scheduling committee gathered information from the staff and



administration and decided on several attributes that are important for any schedule adopted by DPM.

- Yesterday the scheduling committee met all day and were presented with 9 different scheduling options.
- Tomorrow is a late start day and the entire staff will meet so that the scheduling committee can talk about what they have accomplished and will present 4 schedule concepts. There will be a large group presentation and then the group break off into smaller groups. The goal is not to select a schedule, it's to gather feedback.
- \circ The scheduling committee will meet again all day on 11/4.
- On 11/5, there will be Principal Coffees to talk specifically about scheduling. Coffees will be held at 9am, 1pm, and 6pm. The scheduling committee wants to be open, clear and transparent.
- Next Tuesday, a very short presentation will be given to the BOE.

Question/Answer session following Tom's report:

Q - Will the new schedule be implemented next year?

A - Yes the schedule will be implemented next year. The goal is to have a new schedule ready to present to the BOE by January.

Q - *Is a vote needed to approve the new schedule?*

A - We want to take proper procedures and we are in the talking stage with the teacher union.

Q - Have you identified best practices in terms of scheduling?

A - We have found some very interesting models - a school in Texas, a charter school in Wisconsin, and some schools in Michigan. We are not looking to replicate another school's schedule - that might happen, but we are looking for innovative, creative uses of school time.

Q - What is the biggest benefit to kids of having a new schedule? Will the current 7th graders be looping?

A - There has been no looping talk yet. The purpose is to come up with more personalized and differentiated learning opportunities for all students. There were some common themes found in the 9 schedules reviewed so far.

Q - Are you starting over from scratch? Are you changing the school start/stop times?

A - No, this is not starting over from scratch. We are looking at the structure of a school day, not moving teachers around or changing start and stop times.

Q - 5 minutes for a conference seems short. Can they be longer?

A - We are trying to move to a more content based conferencing so that parents are able to talk to each teacher, not just one teacher about all subjects. The process is being analyzed - we want it to be meaningful and to provide an opportunity to connect.

Q - Can there be more time for Math and LA?

A - It's really a matter of logistics and equity. These conferences are meant to be a "touching base" opportunity. If parents and teachers need to talk further, a separate conference or phone call should be scheduled for an in depth conversation.

Q - Will the spring conferences be optional again?

A - Yes, but that doesn't mean you can't meet with your child's teacher(s).

September 23, 2014 Board of Education Meeting

2014 Budget Hearing:

Jennifer Hermes, Assistant Superintendent of Business Services, led the presentation of budget.

- All legal standards have been followed prior to this vote.
- Tentative budget has been displayed on website since July 22
- Budget highlights:
 - -Three Math specialist positions have been added
 - Grade 5 Bridges materials
 - -Grade 7 and 8 materials for new Algebra curriculum
 - -Reading/Writing Curriculum materials
 - Reading Specialist position
 - Deer Path Middle School STEM installation

-Capital Projects – abatement and replacement of flooring at Everett School, replacement of main drive at Deer Path Middle School, replacement of main and side drive at Sheridan School, replacement of Deer Path Middle School lockers, installation of 3M security film at all schools.

- Overall, \$ 35, 460,787 in revenues and \$ 35, 301,062 in expenditures with a difference of \$ 159,725.
- District is spending more on capital expenditures to enhance our programs. These expenditures were not possible during and directly following the economic downturn when all expenditures were for safety improvements only.
- All board members approved budget.

BOE Meeting:

President's Report by Bill Andersen:

• Mr. Andersen shared the two goals of the BOE. First, they need to provide a mission and vision for the district. This is to be used as a blueprint for the administration for the next few years. Thanks to Beth Clemmenson for her work on this – she ensured that all voices in the community were heard. The second goal of the BOE is to provide oversight. This is essential and only performed by the BOE. It is responsible for setting the tax rate and making sure funds are looked after. Mr. Andersen thanked Rick Schuler, Mike Borkowski and Rob Lemke for their time regarding the district's finances.

Superintendent's Report by Michael Simeck:

- Mr. Simeck stated there is a pleasant trend regarding enrollment in the district. We are 51 students fewer than last year, but there is no immediate impact on any programs.
- He thanked the Spirit of 67 for the climbing wall donation at Deer Path Middle School. He enjoyed watching the staff come together for training on the equipment and is excited for the opportunities it will bring to all students at Deer Path.
- Inspiration Block fits perfectly with the district's mission and vision. He was impressed with the commitment of the Cherokee School staff.
- He thanked Mrs. White and all of the teachers at Everett School for providing him with a tour of the new building improvements.
- He welcomed Dr. Sapko as the Everett principal and commended her on a terrific start. The staff and community have warmly welcomed her.
- He is very excited about the final mission and vision goals. There were 55 people (staff and community participants) assembled to review data of student achievement and a variety of strategies. He feels the tagline of "educating without boundaries, learning without limits" is language that all can appreciate.

Assistant Superintendent of Curriculum, Instruction, Technology and Assessment, Lauren Fagel:

- 2015 -16 calendar presentation
- She tried to incorporate suggestions by the BOE last year to reduce the amount of half days and short weeks.
- According to the State of Illinois, a district may take four institute days.



- The structure of Parent-Teacher Conferences is being examined to determine if this the best model for all
- Calendar can be amended throughout the year

Fund Balance Board Policy 4:20:

- Goal is to keep Fund Balance above 10 15% range

Lesley Fisher, Board Member, Education Committee:

- Thanked Ms. Jackson for presenting the Inspiration Block and is excited to see the community embrace the concept. For the incoming Kindergarten students at Cherokee, 21 choose inquiry-based learning and 22 choose language- based learning.
- Judy Epke updated the committee on the Deer Path Smart Lab installation. Teacher training is taking place while the principals are realigning schedules to maximize student participation in this learning environment.
- Maker movement is a new curriculum being implemented throughout the district. Fabrication devices such as 3D printers and physical computing items such as Google glasses are used.
- Staff is looking for ways to incorporate this type of learning beyond STEM class so more students can benefit.
- Grades 2 8 will continue to take the NWEA two times a year. Fall scores will allow for a baseline and Spring results will show growth.
- Grades 3 8 will take the PARC instead of the ISAT this year. Testing will occur in March and May. PARC is more closely aligned with the Common Core standards. It is a lengthier test.
- SB7 will be in effect during the 2016-7 school year. This will require that students' assessments will be a part of teacher evaluations.
