### Guest Speakers -

#### Emilie Correa, D67 Emotional Wellness Coordinator

- Emilie has degrees in Art History, Elementary Education and School Counseling. She was a middle school bilingual teacher in Waukegan and a Spanish teacher at DPM. She will continue to teach Spanish on the 5th/6th side.
- Emilie believes her new position as D67 Emotional Wellness Coordinator is a great fit and she's excited to get to work everyday.
- The foundation of Emotional Wellness began in 2007-8 when the D67
   Student Development Committee was formed. The present structure of Emotional Wellness consists of District and Building level EW committees, EW Mentors at each school, and the D67 Emotional Wellness Coordinator.
- Emilie is an advocate for social-emotional character development and it is important to her that students feel comfortable, are happy to go to school and have friends and trusted adults to talk to.



- Emotional Wellness implications for students include increased test scores, engagement in learning, motivation to learn and school attendance, and decreased disciplinary referrals, classroom disruptions, bullying and at-risk behaviors.
- Emotional Wellness implications for faculty and administration include improved school climate/culture and productivity/innovation, increased focus/engagement, morale, retention and job satisfaction, and positivity, and decreased absenteeism and health care costs.
- As we begin our journey, it is important to remember that "we can't direct the wind but we can adjust the sails."
- Emilie invites anyone to call or email her with questions or concerns.

### **Administrator Reports**

#### Tom Cardamone, Principal 5/6 and Michael Kroll, Assistant Principal 5/6

- Tom says the school year is off to a good, positive start. His wife teaches dance locally and they have a son in 4th grade and a daughter in 5th grade.
- Over the summer, Tom and Michael worked hard to schedule all 5th and 6th grade students.
- There are 34 new students on the east side. A new student lunch was held last week with the school social workers.
- WEB (Where Everyone Belongs) was held on 8/22. It was an opportunity for 8th graders to mentor 5th graders. A lot of positive feedback was received. Improvements continue to be made to the program.
- DPME Curriculum Night is this Thursday, September 18, at 6:30 p.m. in the Peck Gym.
- From 6:30-8 p.m. on Curriculum Night, Quest will run a full lunch program so that parents can see what their student's lunch period is like.

- There will be an Activities Fair during lunch so that students can learn more about club offerings.
- There are more sections of Advisory classes this year and Emilie Correa will be helping with the Advisory curriculum.
- There are a lot of new staff members, especially in world language where we have new Latin, Spanish and French teachers. You can meet them all at Curriculum Night.

### Renee DeVore, Principal 7/8 and Paul Suminski, Assistant Principal 7/8

- This is Renee's third year as Principal of DPMW and this has been the smoothest beginning of the school year transition yet.
- Curriculum Night is tonight, September 16, at 6:30 p.m.
- Student and teacher feedback about Advisory was used to revamp the program this year. We want the time spent in Advisory to be meaningful, so this year Advisory is separate from Homeroom (different groups of students and different faculty leaders for each group). Advisory will be on Mondays and that day was chosen because it is assumed that most students will have completed their homework over the weekend and there are fewer Mondays during the school year (due to holidays). The first few weeks of Advisory will be team building, followed by some instruction/discussion about study skills, and at year-end there may be an exploratory time where teachers and students can explore different interests/talents. Teachers will meet once a month to discuss Advisory and provide feedback about the program.
- Homework resources for DPMW include:
  - Math Resource Center starts 10/7 and will be open on Tuesdays and Thursdays 3:45-4:30 in Mrs. Paul's room. It is a drop in resource.
  - Writing Resource Center starts 10/8 and will be open on Wednesdays 3:45-4:30 in Mrs. Tuttle's room. Also a drop in resource.
  - Study Skills Class After school on Mondays with Mrs. Paul. 10 students may sign up for this class.
- Fall athletics are in full swing girls field hockey, girls volleyball, cross country, some intramurals.
- There will be an Activities Fair during lunch so that students can learn more about club offerings. The first Friday Flyer of October will have an attachments about club offerings too.

Both Tom and Renee discussed the plan to implement a 5th through 8th schedule:

- Currently, there are three different schedules in the building 5th, 6th and 7/8th.
- Teachers spent a lot of time reading over the summer about grading practices and philosophies, teacher assessment, relationships between adults and students and academic success. The majority read <u>Mindset</u> by Carol Dweck, which explains fixed and growth mindsets and how those can help/ hinder academic success.
- There is a scheduling committee consisting of 12 teachers who represent the staff. They are currently in the brainstorming stage and there are 2 huge "wish lists" in the teacher lounges where teachers can share their wants, needs, passions, and hopes. Some norms will be set at the first meeting and the ultimate goal is what we want for the students.
- This is about more than just having a universal bell schedule; we want to understand what opportunities are we creating for students and how are we looking at flexibility.
- The two late starts will be important for professional development and work on scheduling project.
- Updates about the scheduling project will be given to the APT, the BOE and discussed at coffees with the Principals.
- The goal is to have a new schedule proposal by January.

Comment (Sushama Krishnaswamy) - It is the little things that really make an impact on students. When Renee popped into classrooms at the start of the year, this really made my daughter's day.

Question - What is the focus of the Study Skills class? Answer - Mrs. Paul has taught these classes before. She will want to get a feel for the group before deciding on areas to focus attention, but time management is always an important skill to work on.

Christie asked everyone to refer to the Parental Concerns handout, which indicates to parents where they should direct questions. In many cases, directing a question to your child's teacher is the best option.



Comment (Susan Lewin) - Could the teachers communicate to the students what exactly needs to be carried around during the day? This issue came up during our Exec meeting when we discussed school supplies. It seems like there are a lot of supplies that students are carrying around that don't need to be and this makes their dockets very heavy.

Renee - Students can leave their supplies in their lockers. It should be clearer now, after a few weeks of school, what the students need for each class.

Comment (Melinda Hill) - I agree that the students need to be taught what is necessary. I've worked on this with my son too.

### Teacher Liaison - Amy Lamberti

After many years as the DPM APT Teacher Representative, Laura Montgomery will be retiring. She is spending more time at Cherokee in her role as Tech Coach, so Amy will attend our meetings from now on.

This procedure is for **DPM** APT related events only.

District-wide information is to be communicated through the APT Executive Board.

### Messages for the Friday e-newsletter (Friday Flyer) should:

Include "APT" or "APT sponsored" in the title

Be short, to the point (try for less than three lines); if a longer message is needed I can request that the Friday Flyer blurb be linked to the additional details.

Be emailed to me by noon Wednesday for inclusion in that Friday's newsletter

Be emailed to me each week if the message is to run for multiple weeks

#### Messages for the DPM website should:

Include "APT" or "APT sponsored" in the title

Should be short/attention grabbing and can be emailed to me at anytime

**Dates for the DPM calendar** should be emailed to me as soon as you know them. I will forward them to the DPM office to be posted on the school's online calendar.

#### Sandwich Boards

New Families Committee-DPM Report Summary and Recommendations Submitted by: LeaAnne LaVanway, Carol Shearstone September 2014



On Monday, August 18, 2014 we hosted the annual New Families Orientation and tours for DPM East and West.

5<sup>th</sup> grade: 10 new students, 6 attended 6<sup>th</sup> grade: 16 new students, 14 attended 7<sup>th</sup> grade: 9 new students, 7 attended 8<sup>th</sup> grade: 10 new students, 10 attended

#### Since the orientation:

5<sup>th</sup> grade: 4 new students 6<sup>th</sup> grade: 5 new students 7<sup>th</sup> grade: 1 new student

### Total 45 new students, 55 through 9-1-14

This year we had both orientations in the Haskins Center. This worked very well as we only need to set up one location and were able to greet the 7/8<sup>th</sup> grade families as they arrived. Last year the logistics of two locations prevented us from getting to the Haskins Center before arriving families. Each family received a folder of information. We delivered the folders to homes for those who did not attend the orientation. Additional folders are housed in each DPM office staff provide one to each family that registers after the Orientation.

15 effort students served as tour guides, plus 3 members from teaching staff helped us with the day. We served pizza and drinks to the Effort students, which has been the custom for many years. This year the Effort teachers requested the pizza and drinks be served in between the two orientations so that  $6^{\rm th}$  grade volunteers would not need to stay through the  $7/8^{\rm th}$  orientation in order to take part in the pizza.

In addition, Christie Theis, President, DPM APT and Martha Zeeman, President, Spirit of 67 spoke about both organizations during the orientation.

### **Budget:**



This year we used Quest Food Service for the day. Anne Simmons is extremely responsive and does a great job. Coffee and cookies were provided for the new families (estimated 39 new students plus 2 adults for each). There were 4 pots of coffee. There were 10 dozen cookies and none were left over. Pizza, drinks, and cookies were provided for the 15 Effort volunteers. The cost of this was \$183.00. Our unconfirmed budget was \$175.00. This included Nametags and small water bottles were purchased, but not submitted for reimbursement.

### Follow-Up:

We will continue to monitor new families during the school year. We will follow-up with the families who started in the beginning of the year via email to see how they are settling in and if they have any questions. As new families register during the year, we will contact them via email to confirm they have received a new families folder from the office and introduce ourselves to see if we can answer any questions they may have. We have access to a Google Document from Terry Boulton to see when new families register at DPM.

#### Recommendations:

Continue to hold orientations in one location for both 5/6 presentations and 7/8 presentations.

Continue to offer Effort students pizza appreciation in between the two presentations to allow 6<sup>th</sup> grade volunteers to leave after they are finished.

Add the DPM end of day pick up map created by Renee Devore to DPM folders. The map is much easier than trying to write a description as to how student pick up works.

This year we had requests from Spirit of 67 for addresses of parents so they could drop off water bottles to new families. If they want to continue to provide water bottles for new families I think it would be better if they handed them out at the orientation. We also had a request from membership/directory for our contact information. Because the document we receive from DPM with sensitive information on students, I checked with Terry Boulton who handles all new student registrations at DPM, and she said we are only allowed to contact new families via



email. I did relay that information onto the directory person. A suggestion would be to have them have their own table at the orientation where they can talk with new families regarding the benefits of the APT and then have the sign up directly with them if they are interested?


